What is CIA Triad?

CIA Triad is a group of principles that are needed for Security information. The definition as it states in the text says "the CIA triad, is a model designed to guide policies for information security within an organization." (Accessed 25 Sept. 2024.). CIA stands for Confidentiality, Integrity, and availability. All three of those principles have a different meaning.

Confidentiality

In the text it describes confidentiality as, "Data should be handled based on the organization's required privacy." (Accessed 25 Sept. 2024.) . For example, a two way verification. Integrity helps maintain the privacy of the information. For example, somebody stole your bank information and was making unusual purchases. Integrity described in the text states "Ensure employees are knowledgeable about compliance and regulatory requirements to minimize human error."
