Introduction

My academic career at Old Dominion University Global has been the foundation of my Cybersecurity career growth. My studies helped me refine my soft skills, including communication, critical thinking, research, and problem-solving. I also developed proficiency in hard skills in technologies such as Linux, tools like Metasploit and Wireshark, and troubleshooting tools like Nmap, NSLookup, and Ping, among others. The convenience of ODU Global enabled me to pursue my dream of a career in cybersecurity. The courses I enjoyed the most were Digital Forensics, Ethical Hacking and Penetration Testing, and Cybercriminology: Foundations. These courses allowed me to decide that I want to pursue an Ethical Hacking career as a red team member. Celeste Fowles Nguyen (2013) describes it as "a living portal, whereby identity is shared with others and reimagined in narrative and conversation." Technical Skills

Technical skills are critical in cybersecurity. Understanding technologies and their applications enabled cybersecurity professionals to develop best practices for protecting data within devices and networks. Courses such as Linux for Cybersecurity, Digital Forensics, and Ethical Hacking and Penetration Testing enabled me to practice both offensive and defensive strategies in a secure environment. These strategies allowed me to observe devices and network behaviors when they were protected versus under attack. I use the tools that I learned during those courses daily in my new job. Being able to understand and contribute to my new team has been a very satisfactory experience. Cybersecurity is a constantly evolving field with new

technologies emerging at a rapid pace and many lacking basic security measures. It is a constant race against time for professionals in the field to provide the necessary security without rendering the systems unusable.

Communication Skill

One of the most powerful skills to have. The ability to convey thoughts and ideas in a precise and concise matter helps the growth and unity of a team. Being able to communicate and support others or discuss any opposition without offending or diminishing someone else's hard work is an essential skill in today's work and personal environment. Classes such as Cyber Law, Crime and Computer Applications, and Cybersecurity and Social Sciences are beneficial for developing this kind of skill. These courses explore controversial topics through discussions with defenders of various perspectives. Being able to defend your point of view, with good supporting references, in an organized manner, has helped me with both my past and current teams. We engage in discussions, exchange ideas, and even disagree with one another, all in a respectful manner. My new work environment is fast-paced, requiring constant communication to support various areas and environments. ODU has helped me immensely in this area.

Critical Thinking

During my time at ODU, critical thinking has been a primary skill utilized in every course. Professors provided us with material and asked us to read carefully and analyze the context of each reading material. They wanted more than paraphrasing and direct quotes. They challenged us to apply that information to our everyday lives and careers. Cyberlaw has

prompted us to reevaluate our perspectives, highlighting where morals intersect with established laws. Cybersecurity, Technology, and Society prompted us to examine research on DNA coding, such as efforts to inject malware into computers. Researchers accomplished this and subsequently published their findings; however, our professor wanted implications, dangers, and ethics to be applied to the study. We were provided with enough information to form our own opinions on the matter. We were tasked with researching the potential implications and fallouts. Every class provided me with information and pushed me to dig deeper. These help me become more comfortable analyzing the information I receive and distinguishing between facts and rumors. It is a fantastic skill to possess, and I am grateful to ODU for pushing me to reach new limits.

Research Skills

The amount of information I found was staggering, and going through it required both critical thinking and problem-solving skills. These types of projects enable me to observe how investigators work and utilize available resources to solve crimes and mysteries. This skill has been invaluable at my current job, where old and new technologies come together to form something unique. My job requires me to use new technologies to protect old ones that cannot be replaced at the moment. Old Dominion University greatly assisted me in understanding and addressing this type of problem without compromising the current environment.
