Creating Demographic Data Booklets

Latin America

Your task is to create a demographic data booklet that presents information on a country of the Latin American culture region. Research the following information on your country.

Obtain the following information for your country:

- net growth rate (birth rate death rate = net growth rate)
- per capita GDP
- life expectancy (male and female)
- infant mortality
- various sectors of the economy* (labor force distribution)
- major ethnic groups*
- rural/urban distribution*
- age distribution*
- arable/non-arable land*
- literacy rate*
- percentages of major religions*
- major languages
- 1. All of the starred items must be presented in the form of a circle graph. Other items on the list are best presented as bar graphs.
- 2. Keep in mind that not all of the statistics will add up to 100%. For example, you may only have the percentage of people living in urban areas. You would subtract from 100 to find the percentage of people living in rural areas.
- 3. Be sure to provide a title for each of the graphs.
- 4. Be sure to include the units of measurement. Life expectancy is measured in years and some other statistics are reported as numbers per thousand.

In addition, your booklet must include a cover. Be sure the cover contains the following information.

- the country name
- illustrations of major resources and exports
- · major physical features of the country
- names of cities with over one million people
- extras (additional topics of your choice)

To what extent does the data in your booklet support the following generalizations?

- The closer to the equator the higher the per capita GDP.
- Countries with high birth rates have high infant mortality rates.
- Life expectancy for males is usually higher than the life expectancy for females.
- Countries with large percentages of arable land have large percentages of people engaged in agriculture.
- Countries with high literacy rates have a high percentage of people living in urban areas.
- Landlocked countries have higher per capita GDPs than coastal countries.
- Most of the countries of Latin America use Spanish as their official language.
- Countries with high infant mortality rates have lower life expectancies.
