Comparing Countries: Central Asia Semantic Feature Analysis

Ethnicity, religion, language, and a shared history can combine to pull a country together and reawaken latent feelings of nationalism. In contrast, the same forces can pull a country apart. The semantic feature analysis, a language arts tool for recognizing nuances of meaning in vocabulary words, can be used to compare the various attributes of the countries of the Caucasus and Central Asia.

- 1. Locate the countries of Central Asia and the Caucasus.
- 2. Describe their location relative to the Russian Federation.
- 3. Predict which countries would be most likely to be affected by influences from bordering countries.
- 4. Which features of the physical environment may facilitate interaction?
- 5. Which features of the physical environment may inhibit interaction?
