Requirements for Psychology Major

- 38 hours; C or better in ALL Psyc courses
- No more than ONE 200-level apply to 38 (Psyc 201)
- □ Four Required 14 credits
 - PSYC 201S (must pass with a C or better)
 - PSYC 316 (prerequisite: MATH 102M or 103; min. C)
 - PSYC 317 (prerequisite: PSYC 316)
 - PSYC 318W (prerequisite: Engl 110 and Engl 211, 221 or 231; PSYC 317 - min. C)
- One course from Areas I-IV 12 credits
- □ Psyc Electives 12 credits (300-400 level)

Area 1: Biological Bases & Cognition

- □ PSYC 410 Cognition
- PSYC 413 Sensation and Perception
- PSYC 424 Physiological
- One course (3 credits) MUST come from this area
- Recommendation: take after 12 credit hours of psychology coursework


Psychology Elective Courses

- □ Transfer (no more than one 200-level; Psyc 201)
- Better preparation for career &/or graduate school
 - Experiential learning
