Questions to Advance Research on Equitable Coastal Resilience

Six definitional and measurement questions:

- ① What does equity mean in the context of coastal resilience?
- ② Who decides on the definition and through what process?
- 3 What does success in advancing social equity in coastal resilience look like?
- What does a successful engaged/applied research or on-the-ground project look like?
- S How do we track equity across time and space, recognizing the need for comparison while acknowledging the local context?
- How do we know we are making a difference in advancing equity while building coastal resilience?

Six general research questions that can be asked in and across different focus areas

These research questions capture the essence of the knowledge gaps identified by workshop participants while being sufficiently general to be applied to different focus areas related to equitable coastal resilience.

- ① How can we assess that equity-related metrics are making a difference?
- ② How can we develop metrics for universality and comparative value while also ensuring their local salience?
- 3 How do we address the implications of labeling a community?
- What is the role of participatory research and co-production in defining and applying equity and coastal resilience metrics?
- ⑤ How can we detect when dynamics and/or outcomes are shifting and determine the effects?
- What meta-level analysis is needed?

Suggested focus areas:

- Infrastructure planning
- Inclusion in decision making
- Metrics and mapping of social equity and coastal resilience
- Coastal squeeze and climigration
- Policy analysis and decision making
- Emergency and disaster management
