# Teaching Licensure Concentration Overview

In this concentration, students take courses through both the English department of the College of Arts and Letters and the Teaching and Learning department of the Darden College of Education and Professional Studies. Since this program combines the usual requirements of a college major and minor, it has a heavy course load. As such, to "Finish in Four" students will need to take courses over their summer semesters. However, many students do not finish their degree in four years, and there is no pressure to do so.

The program, which is accredited by the Commonwealth of Virginia, allows students to earn their teaching licensure in Virginia. It prepares students for a full range of secondary school teaching assignments. Virginia has licensure reciprocity agreements with thirty other states should a student leave the state.

While students earn a Bachelor of Arts in English, they also have the option of working toward a Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) certificate through Old Dominion University's English Department, which will help them to better serve the diverse learners at the schools and communities they will be teaching in.
