





	<p>Paragraph: Individuals and groups bring about social, political, and economic change.</p> <p>Select Subheading: JoAnn Robinson</p> <p>The arrest of Rose Parks for riding in the white section of a bus in Alabama precipitated the Montgomery Bus Boycott. Few have heard of Jo Ann Robinson, a civil rights activist, professor at Alabama College, and president of the Women’s Political Council. She organized the logistics of the bus boycott.</p> <p>Embed: https://upload.wikimedia.org/wikipedia/en/9/9e/Jo_Ann_Robinson_booking_photo.jpg</p> <p>Set image placement. Once the image appears, hover at the top to reveal options.</p>  <p>Select the third from the left to wrap text around the image. Check out the other options.</p>
<p>Add a Quote</p>	<p>Quote: There has been talk . . . of planning a city-wide boycott of busses. We, sir, do not feel that forceful measures are necessary in bargaining for a convenience which is right for all bus passengers. . . .</p>
<p>Add a map (Express Map)</p> <p>Separator icon</p>	<p>Express Map:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Search for Montgomery, Alabama. Add a pin. • Add bus image from folder. • Search for 900 Griffin Boulevard, Farmville Virginia. Add a pin • Add image strike. • From above the map, select Add Annotation and write the name of the Event, Montgomery Bus Boycott, 1953; Student Strike at Moton High School, 1951. • Investigate the options on the map under the cog. • Place Map. <p>Separator: Add a line to separate content.</p>
<p>Add Subheading</p> <p>Add a paragraph</p>	<p>Subheading: Barbara Johns</p> <p>In April 1951, sixteen-year-old Barbara Johns led a student strike at the segregated Moton High School in Farmville, Virginia to protest the poor conditions at the school. The school was built for 180 students, but held over 450. The NAACP sued the school board on behalf of the students highlighting inequality. Even though they lost their case, <i>Davis v. Board of Education of Prince Edward County</i> in 1953, it was one of the five cases in the landmark <i>Brown v. Board of Education</i> case.</p> <p>Figure out how to italicize the court cases.</p>

<p>Add a sidecar</p>	<p>Search for maps with the following id: b159c8edea5d4d338ff5af26c151846e</p> <p>Be sure to search in organization</p> <p>https://vbschools.maps.arcgis.com/home/webmap/viewer.html?webmap=b159c8edea5d4d338ff5af26c151846e</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select the Life After Jim Crow map. 2. Edit the map layers—shut off Percent African American, 1940 as it is a chart, not yet supported in the builder. Click the eyeball to turn the layer off. 3. Click the Place map button in the lower right. 4. Add the following text <p>Great Migration North (make bold)</p> <p>African Americans left the fields of the South and moved to northern industrial cities during the 1920s and again in the 1950s. In many cases they encountered segregation in housing. Click on the markers to view images of life in the city.</p> <p>In lower right, select the big plus sign to add a new slide.</p>

Select Great Migration edited 1. Edit the map layers—shut off Map Notes, Connections. Again a chart must have been present. . 2. Place map. 3. Add the following text. <p>Examine the dots for the cities. Did a higher percentage of African Americans move north between 1910 and 1940 or 1940 and 1970?</p>
<p>Add a Web Scene</p>	<p>First you need to get the share code for the scene. Share icon, above the bottom cog from the menu furthest right, and copy the embed code. Select the embed code.</p> <p>For now paste in. <pre><iframe width="500" height="400" frameborder="0" scrolling="no" allowfullscreen src="https://arcg.is/1qi9bv"></iframe></pre></p> <p>Make the scene span the whole page. What does the icon in the upper right of the scene do? Can you access all of the slides in the original scene?</p>
<p>Add an app via the Button option</p>	<p>Select Button Name it: Story Map Tour</p> <p>Link to use: https://vga.maps.arcgis.com/apps/MapTour/index.html?appid=a41d42c97af3413abad1b3805d785b0d</p>
<p>PUBLISH and share.</p>	<p>Click the three dots to the right of the Publish button and view the published story. Check the Sharing options.</p> <p>Here is my finished product, that is shared publicly. https://storymaps.arcgis.com/stories/3fd5bd3bf2224d7f941c2d38cbaea024</p>
