I believe this collaboration made everyone's final products that much better than they already were.

Following our review of each other's work we also discussed practical aspects like the titles we would use, how we planned to structure our pitch presentations, and even the idea of sharing Grammarly accounts to enhance the quality of our work. As I've discussed previously, these discussions were what truly made the group experience enjoyable and helped us all have the highest standard of work.

As I reflect on this experience, I'm extremely grateful for the team that I was assigned. The camaraderie and mutual support were standout aspects of this project, and I had an extremely rewarding time working with my group members.
