Major Assignment

PRACTICE LAB: Integrated Lead Poisoning Prevention Assignment – worth 30% of final grade

MPH 613 includes a **Practice Lab** where students take the knowledge and skills acquired in the course and apply them to a practical public health problem similar to what might be found in the real world. The Practice Lab is one of a continuing series of problem or scenario-based activities in the MPH program aimed at providing students with applied practice experience. These practice activities, which are guided by MPH competencies, progressively prepare students for the second-year practicum process, provide opportunities to apply track-specific coursework, and help ensure that MPH graduates are well equipped for the real world of public health practice when they assume positions as public health professionals.

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For the MPH 613 Practice Lab, students complete an Integrated Lead Poisoning Prevention Assignment. Students will be given a mock community with a variety of potential lead sources and a richly diverse population. In this individual, written assignment, students must utilize what they have learned about lead and lead poisoning, risk communication, and cultural competence to design a community lead poisoning education and prevention effort (including a communication strategy) that is inclusive. The first component of the assignment involves identifying and being cognizant of cultural values and practices in the assignment's mock community, and applying this awareness to the design of an inclusive lead poisoning education and prevention program. The second major component of the assignment involves describing the importance of cultural competence in communicating public health content. The third major component involves selecting specific risk communication strategies for different audiences and sectors in the mock community and explaining how those choices contribute to an effective and inclusive lead poisoning prevention program. By integrating the various components (lead information, cultural values and practices, risk communication) into an integrated assignment, students not only cover the three foundational competencies but employ them in the design of integrated, effective public health programs.

Content most relevant to the assignment is covered in the following course sessions: Lead and Lead Poisoning: A Continuing Threat to Public Health; Environmental Risk Communication, CERC; Environmental Justice and Vulnerable Populations, Cultural Competence and Inclusiveness in Policy and Program Design and Implementation. *

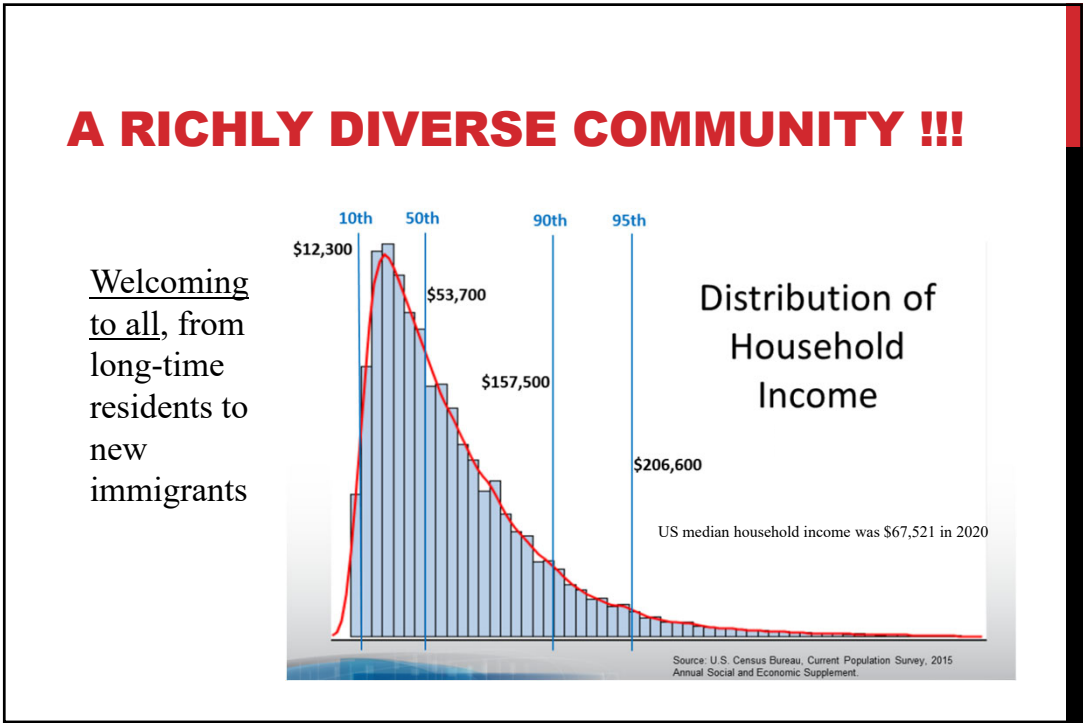

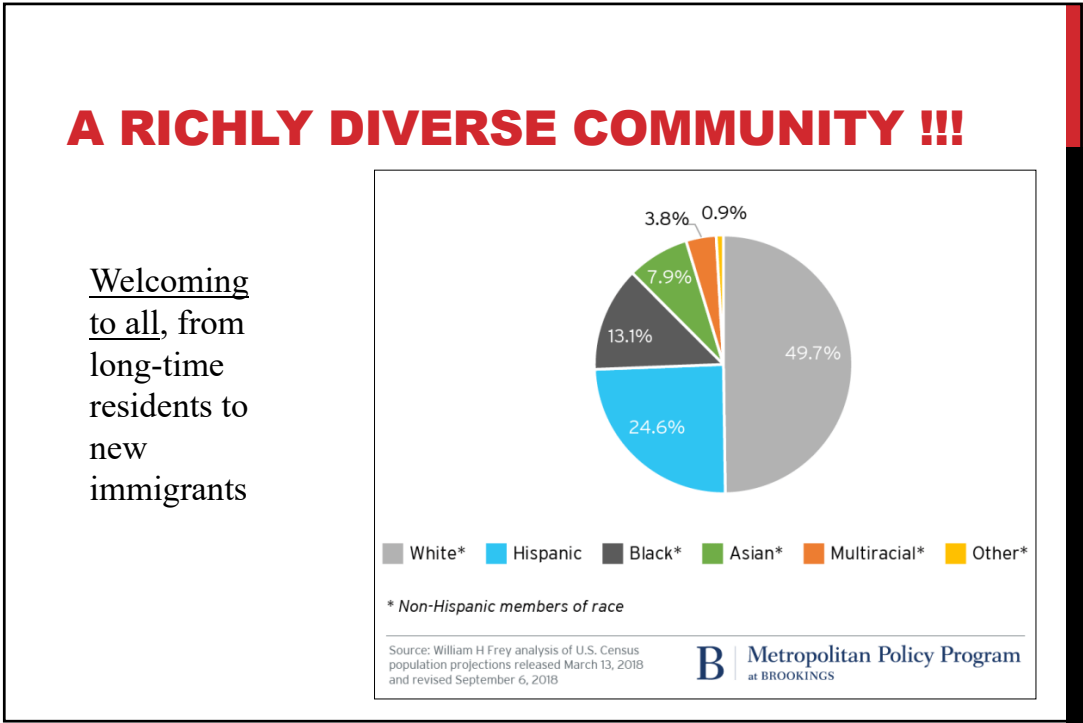

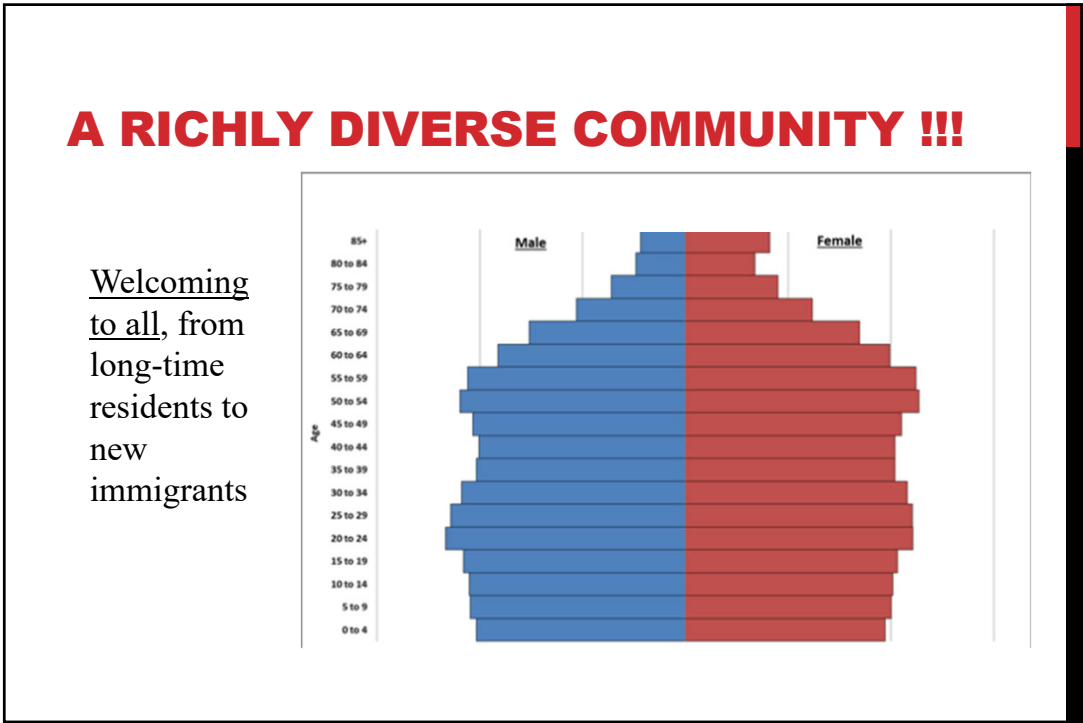
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WELCOME NEW RESIDENTS DAY !!!

Fostering learning and STEM education

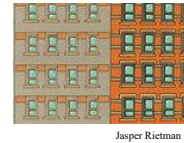
Every school-age child gets a free science kit from the HappyTown PTA!
