

FORMS OF CYBERBULLYING & HARASSMENT

- Doxxing, impersonation, threats, hate speech
- Non-consensual image sharing
- Cyberstalking, repeated unwanted contact



PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPACT

- Anxiety, depression, trauma
- Decreased self-esteem, social withdrawal
- Long-term mental health effects on adolescents and adults

SOCIAL IMPACT

- Damage to reputation and relationships
- Effects on school/workplace culture
- Impact on marginalized groups who face targeted harassment
