At Old Dominion University, I have learned the value of education and the importance of community, especially through my language classes. They were the highlight of my college experience and helped me connect with others in a unique way. I have met who have similar interests as me (i.e learning languages) and people who grew up through different cultures. My perspective on life has expanded and my experience at Old Dominion only encourages me to learn more.

One class that inspires me to this day is my JAPN 312 class. I remember prior to taking it, I had not taken a Japanese class or used the language in four years, and it was the most advanced Japanese class at Old Dominion University. To get into the class, I had taken a placement exam and was surprised to be placed in JAPN 311. Unfortunately, JAPN 311 was not offered at the time, so I was encouraged to take JAPN 312. I accepted the challenge, albeit being very nervous about it.
