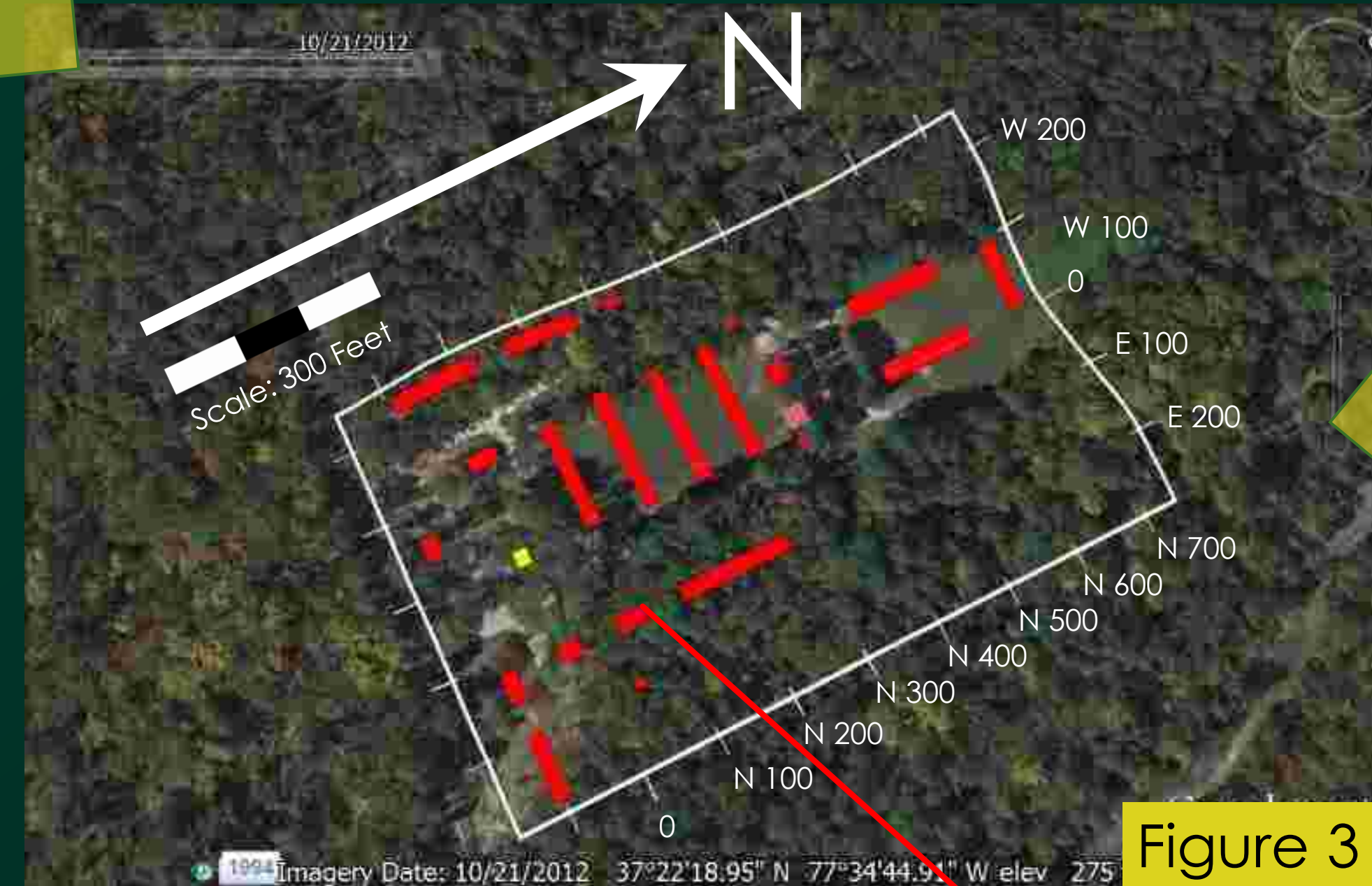

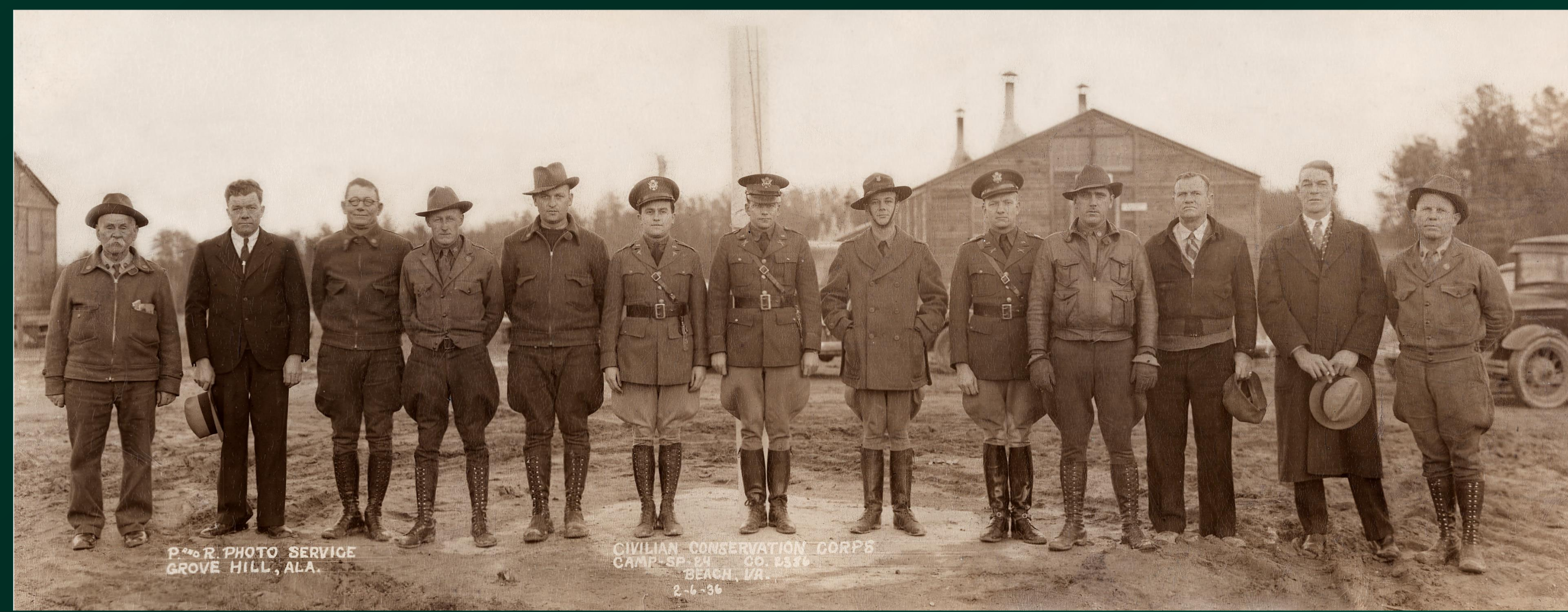
Anecdotal Evidence: Often used to refer to Oral Traditions, or stories that are passed down from generation to generation. By virtue of this "passing down" facts can get distorted or misremembered, which can diminish the usefulness to Archaeologists. These stories are also often related to family history- and therefore generally not found in the historic record (Orser: 2000, pp. 12-14).

Inventory (or Survey): Establishing the location, and making a preliminary assessment of a site (Sutton, et al: 2009)
Datum: Reference point used for making a site grid.
