

In the final 50 hours of my internship, my team was tasked with finalizing a presentation to go along with the technical blueprint. This phase proved to be the most rigorous phase of the internship. Our check ins with our supervisor were often moved up to twice a week, as this presentation was extremely important to marketing our security system to investors.

Our supervisor instructed us that while the presentation should be detailed and show the thoroughness of our blueprint, it should at the same time be simple enough to be explained to someone who doesn't know much about the system or cybersecurity. In our finalizing meeting with our supervisor gave us tasks on exactly what needed to be fixed. Despite this meeting spanning around 1-2 hours, when our normal meetings are usually no longer than 20 minutes, by the end we finalized the presentation and eventually had to send it off to get approved by the CEO.
