Openness allows people to speak up without fear, share new ideas, and offer constructive feedback, which helps the team anticipate and solve problems more effectively. In practice, this could look like a project team reviewing setbacks openly in a meeting, discussing what went wrong and how to improve. By

modeling this behavior, leaders create a culture where learning from failures is normalized, accountability is shared, and team members feel more confident taking initiative and contributing their perspectives (Coyle, 2018, p. 89).

ESTABLISHING PURPOSE

The final element Coyle identifies is a clear and compelling sense of purpose. When team members understand and connect with the organization's goals and values, they are more motivated, committed, and willing to go the extra mile. Purpose gives meaning to daily tasks and helps people see how their contributions fit into the bigger picture. Coyle illustrates this by noting how Pixar's mission to tell engaging stories unites employees across departments, fostering collaboration and innovation. Without a shared purpose, even talented individuals can feel disconnected, which hurts cohesion and overall effectiveness (Coyle, 2018, p. 112).

Coyle's insights offer practical guidance for leaders looking to strengthen their team's culture. Prioritizing safety, encouraging openness, and clarifying purpose directly affect how people collaborate and stay committed. When team members feel safe, they share ideas and concerns freely, which sparks innovation and prevents mistakes.
