A participatory culture is a digital environment where people actively create, share, and collaborate not just consume content.



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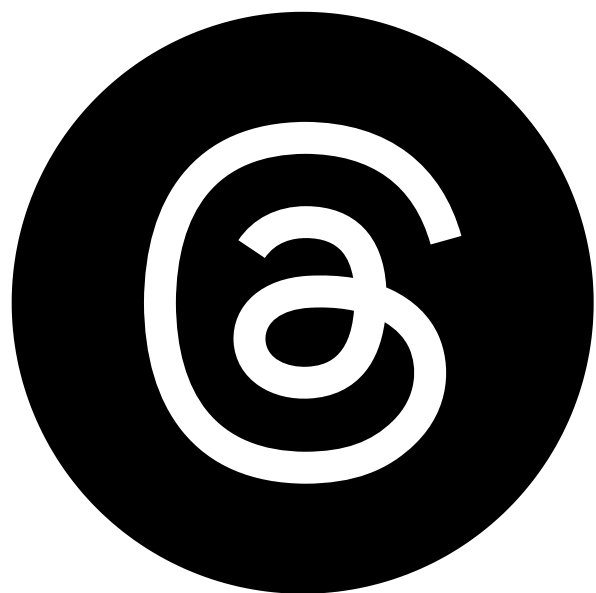
Core Elements of Participatory Culture
