10 Step IRP Model

- 1. Define the problem or state the research question
- 2. Justify using an interdisciplinary approach
- 3. Identify relevant disciplines
- 4. Conduct the literature search
- 5. Develop adequacy in each discipline
- 6. Analyze the problem and evaluate each insight or theory
- 7. Identify conflicts between insights
- 8. Create common ground between insights
- 9. Create a more comprehensive understanding
- 10. Reflect on, test, and communicate the understanding



Details of each step

- 1. Simple! What is the research question that requires more than one discipline for insight
- 2.NOT just one discipline can come to an understanding of the problem, must have an unresolved societal need
- 3. CHOOSE disciplines that have relevant research and an overall perspective on the topic of research, **narrow** out disciplines that don't!
- 4. Research how the problem has been addressed in books, journals, articles that are focused and **not** too broad on topic
- 5. Adequate; Understand the concept, theories and insight of each discipline involved, dig deep find bias in perspective and only search for accuracy in the problem.
- 6. Analyze: what? How? Questions for perspective of each discipline to determine and integrate theories from each- must be applied to the problem

- 7. CHALLENGE! Identify the conflict with different disciplines. Integration will come from the differences of insight. (make sure authors are talking about the same thing) CONCEPTS, THEORIES, and ASSUMPTIONS are where conflicts arise
- 8. Common ground, Join together to different disciplines and their insight that is comprehensive "build the bridge" concepts are the way to start not assumptions.
- 9.comprehensive understand, form an explanation of what was intergrated and why. It gives more insight into the reason a common ground in step 8 was concluded
- 10.Reflection, review where one own bias may have been integrated. Try to show the reasoning behind discipline theory so the persuasion give can be identified.

- Increase awareness of contraceptive



 The affect of how woman are viewed by making decisions for ones body.


sociology

Life starts at the fetus, Life should not be determined by the mother but each individual unborn because they are a person


The woman importance emotionally and physically should give the woman empowerment over decision of ones body
