Submit an answer for the following questions (one paragraph per question). Students should ask themselves these questions on a daily basis while working through this course, but only need to submit responses once in Canvas and once in their electronic portfolio.

- 1. Am I an entrepreneur? An entrepreneur, as taught in the module, would be someone who introduces new products and services for a "profit". To add on, entrepreneurship is for everyone in which one can identify problems and solutions to a field. There's also Interdisciplinary Entrepreneurship where issues are best solved and solutions identified by collaborators.
