Critical thinking is a key skill that has served me well. I have understood this concept as a professional and as a student in this class. IDS 300W provided reinforcement. A lot of my work is heavily dependent on analysis.

I collected artifacts that highlight those themes. They touch on all subjects. class to the other and my content used was borrowed from different sources. I was able to apply subject matter from legal, information technology, English, and science towards my coursework in leadership.
