CITATION:

For heroism while serving in the line of duty in conducting operations in support of Operation UNIFIED RESPONSE on 15 February 2010. Chief Fluegel directly participated in recovery operations in Cap Haitien, Haiti, in an attempt to rescue four children who had been trapped in a landslide that destroyed the back portion of an elementary school and engulfed a classroom. Throughout a four hour operation conducted in high heat and cramped conditions inside the school, all the while dirt and rocks continued to sporadically fall from the hillside, Chief Fluegel placed himself in the hazard zone and rotated with other U.S. military personnel to dig out the children who had been buried in the mud and rocks of the landslide. Despite multiple warnings from local authorities to evacuate the building, he remained at work in digging for the children even after a second landslide occurred, reburying one of the children, and causing many of the local firemen to refuse to continue to work due to the continued danger of another landslide. By his courageous and prompt actions in the face of great personal risk, Chief Fluegel attempted to prevent the loss of lives, thereby reflecting great credit upon himself and upholding the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the United States Naval Service.
