On November 8th, I walked to the Handsome Biscuit on 4200 Monarch Way in Norfolk, VA and met up with classmates. Handsome Biscuit opened in 2013 and is known for serving sweet potato biscuits along with tasty sides. I walked in and began to talk to my friend, Tiffany. I looked at the chalkboard-like menu and felt a bit overwhelmed. There were many options, each a different and unique combination. On the menu, it said it was a chicken biscuit with pickles, mustard, and covered in honey. My teacher pumped this place up with her good reviews, so I expected for it to be very appetizing. I waited for my food while I filled my cup with root beer. Their root beer was made in home, and I could tell. It was sweet, but not as sweet as brand name root beers. It wasn't too carbonated.
