In this assignment, my group covered Climate Change, and our scenario was a California wildfire brought on by faulty powerlines. In our five-minute breakout, we agreed that our takehome message should be that climate change affects the wildfire and instruct the public to stay calm and listen. Even when questions were structured to get us to contradict, we remained calm and supportive of one another.

Outside of the group, I could personally improve upon making sure I cover all items on the list, such as the "stay calm and listen" message. I found myself having tunnel vision, so I need to improve upon staying on track and addressing the entire problem at hand. After going through this experience, one piece of advice I would give to a colleague is to talk directly to the people and tell them what power they have in a situation.
