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# The Problem:

- Medication Side Effects
- Uncontrolled HBP and Diabetes
  - Oral diseases
- Compromised Immune Systems
- Inadequate or no coverage
- Transportation/Mobility



# Background Information

**Target Population:** Senior citizens. Health disparities due to certain diseases and disabilities

**Cost:** Healthcare costs continue to rise

**Current Outcomes:** Health outcomes are not showing significant improvement despite efforts to improve access

**Need:** Health screenings, chronic disease management, and urgent care

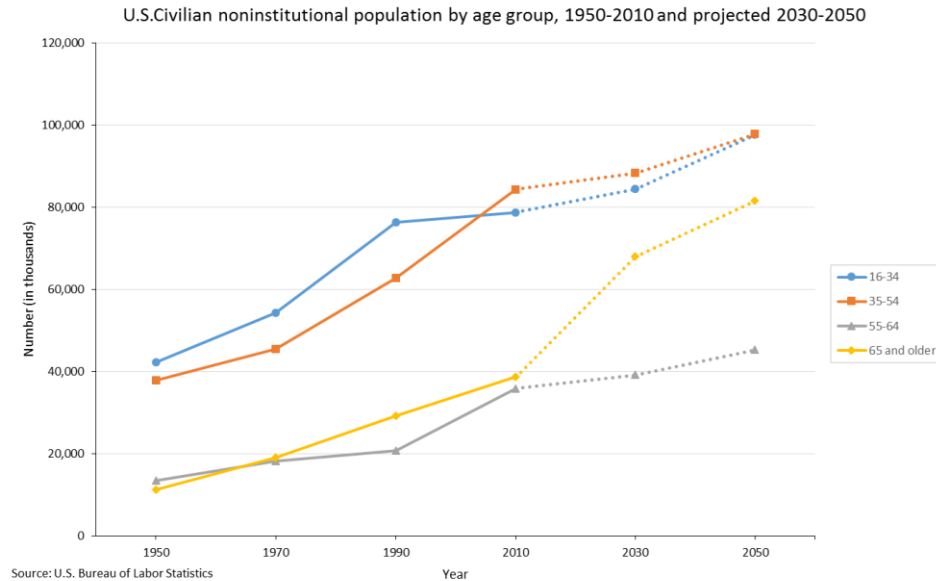

# Intervention: Mobile Health Services Van



- New healthcare model
- Connect patients to other medical and social resources
- Provide accessible and sustainable care



# Expected Results

- Improvements in health outcomes of chronic diseases
  - Better health behaviors/self-management
  - Emphasis on interprofessional collaboration
  - Increase in disease diagnosis/intervention
- Increase in effectiveness of connecting with appropriate healthcare providers
  - Increase in number of senior citizens seeking healthcare
  - Reduction in uncontrolled diseases

# Potential Implications

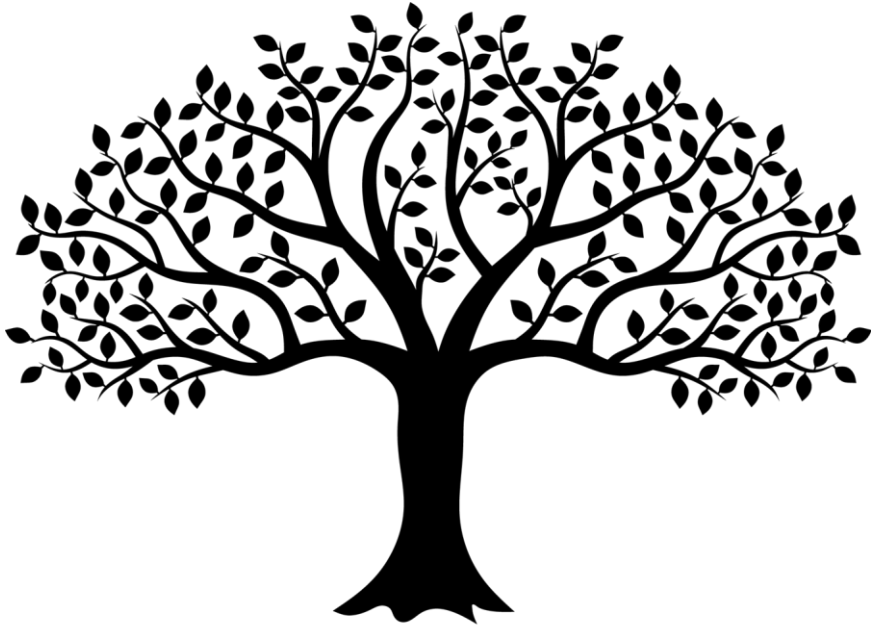
- Disapproval from other healthcare providers

# Roles of the Professionals

## Dental Hygiene

- Administer various health screenings, vaccinations, preventive dental services
- Offer and provide patient education
- Work interprofessionally with public health professionals in care coordination
- Work interprofessionally with other healthcare providers for comprehensive/continuing patient care

## Public Health

- Assist patient with navigating healthcare systems, such as establishing coverage and verifying insurance status
- Identify available medical and social services for patients
- Locate participating healthcare providers as potential referral sources and set up those as needed
