Examples of what Stonewall Norfolk has done

- Conducted Toy drive for "ForKids" and raised \$10,000 to give them
- Raised \$7,000 for "Transgender Assistance Program
- Raised \$5,00 for LGBT Life Center
- Raised \$7,00 for PFLAG

- Sharing data with the research community could potentially provide insight into strategies to help improve health services in the community, this was very helpful during COVID-19 for contract tracing.

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Why is reflection an important part of service learning and service learning community-based research? How would it be implemented?

 Reflection exercises are a crucial component of good service learning since they relate service actions to course material, expanding the educational agenda beyond rote memorization. As a volunteer with a sports league, reflective activities serve as the link between my community work and the educational information I have acquired. Reflection exercises draw the individual's attention to fresh interpretations of events and give a mechanism through which community service may be explored and understood in much the same way a book is read and analyzed for greater comprehension (Akhurst & Mitchell, 2022). Reflection in service learning is implemented through enhanced deep thinking.



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Please describe how service learning and community-based research are important to Global Health.

As with privacy, the value of health research to society is quite significant. It may give valuable information on illness trends and risk factors, treatment results or public health initiatives, functional skills, trends of care, and health care expenditures and use. Service learning enables us to interact directly with communities and see the application of public health ideas in the actual world. Community-based medical research unearths information to support the following: Prevent illness and impairment. Manage sickness symptoms. Improving end-of-life care. Reading or learning about problems is not the same as getting engaged firsthand. It gets people closer to families and people in need and provides them with direct experience and insight into their circumstances. Community service provides students with real-world experience and the opportunity to hone skills such as leadership and timekeeping. Volunteering allows students to apply classroom knowledge to actual situations with real-world consequences.
