Of course, my dream is for all students to leave our school with a love of reading that lasts a lifetime.

We are tasked with teaching diverse communities with varying styles of learning, which is both challenging and limitless in its possibilities. Unlike the classroom, school librarianship is unique in that we have the opportunity to teach all of the students in our schools. "The focus is now on users and understanding how to provide them with successful outcomes and demonstrating success to those who fund the library" (Moran & Morner, 2018, p.442).
