In order to locate WordPress, you must go to odu.edu then click on Information

Technology Services. Once you have clicked on Information Technology Services, you must
then click on the sub-menu tab that is named Software & Services. After you click on that tab,
the services that fall under that tab are then listed in alphabetical order, simply scroll down to W
to locate WordPress. Another easier way to quickly locate WordPress is to simply go to
google.com, type in ODU WordPress into the search bar, and then click the top link. After you
have located this page, there are multiple tabs to help you navigate. If you school down to
Students, the website states, "Each student is allowed one personal site per MIDAS ID". Along
with providing the link to create your own student account. Further down on the page you will
see a heading titled, "Tutorials from WordPress.org", followed by links categorized by the type
of tutorial, these categories include Beginner, Design, and Web Management. If students were

still having trouble navigating, or having trouble setting up their ePortfolio website, you can book an appointment to have in-person help with the process.

The purpose of this tool is to help students create an ePortfolio that they can gather all their research, essays, article reviews, and any other important work they have done into one place. It allows students to have a sense of creativity and freedom while also keeping their work organized. When I first started my semester, hearing about ePortfolios was new to me and I have never heard of creating a portfolio online. I've only heard of it once I started my classes at ODU. I thought it was great tool to have and was excited to be able to compel all my knowledge about Cybersecurity into one place. Once I was able to learn and understand how WordPress worked, I really enjoyed using it. I have since learned how to customize my ePortfolio further by adding video links, or even changing the layout of my categorizes. I've even heard from others who have graduated from ODU, who also used WordPress, that they were able to send their ePortfolios to employers they were applying to, or who still add onto their ePortfolio to this day. Which, after learning that I look forward to doing.
