#### Slide 2:

- → French culture vs American culture
  - ◆ The French have the profound right to protest
  - "Protest Culture"
    - Although not all protests have been successful, it has caused government approval ratings to drop
      - o Macron 21%
      - Sarkozy lost reelection
      - Hollande didnt bother to run for 2nd term
  - ♦ It stems from the 1789 French Revolution
- → Bridge the cultural gap
  - ◆ What is normal here may not be normal in other countries
    - Do NOT use the "thumbs up" symbol in the Middle East as it is seen as the middle finger
    - In Asian households, as well as in Russia and the Ukraine, it is customary to take off one's shoes before entering.
      - At the end of the slide, I will show you an example of an American not following this custom
    - USA doesnt equal AMERCIA
      - Most other countries think calling the US = America that it ignores South America and that the US is ignorant and the only important country in the Western Hemisphere

#### Slide 3:

- → The US is slacking when it comes to bilingual population
  - ◆ 56% of Europeans are bilingual
  - ◆ 44% of Indians are bilingual
    - This is due to the plethora of different languages within these regions
    - According to the Indian constitution, there are 22 official languages
    - In the E.U, there are 23 recognized languages but there are over 60 indigenious regional and minority languages
  - ◆ 20% of the US population is bilingual but that statistic is based off of immigrants and their children
    - Of the homegrown US population, only 9% are bilingual
- → Education
  - ◆ First foreign language starts between 6-9 : Europe
  - ◆ First foreign language starts at 9 : India
  - ♦ First foreign language starts at 13-14 : USA

  - <u>Belgium</u>, Benin, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, <u>Canada</u>, Chad, the Ivory Coast, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Equatorial Guinea, French GuianaFrance, Haiti, <u>Luxembourg</u>, Madagascar, Mali, Monaco, Niger, Rwanda, Senegal, Seychelles, <u>Switzerland</u>, Togo and Vanuatu.
  - Trace amounts in Syria, Lebanon, Laos, Vietnam, and Cambodia due to colonization
    - Spoken mainly by elders and in higher education
- Official language of the UN, Medecins sans frontieres
- Language for the Court of Justice of the EU
- ◆ International Red Cross
- ◆ Amnesty International
- ◆ International Labor Organization
- → 6th most widely spoken language in the world
- → 2nd most studied language
- → 3rd most widely spoken native language in Europe
- → 4th most widely spoken language in the US
  - ◆ Deemed a cultural language in Lousiana and Maine
