On-Campus Employment (Intramural Referee)

In the summer of 2021, I applied for a job I saw listed on ODU Handshake. The job I saw listed was an available position for Intramural Sports referee. Intramural Sports is a sports department that falls under recreation and wellness at ODU. My job as an intramural referee was to preside over intramural games to ensure standard of plays were being met. This means that I would make calls during intramural games and issue penalties if an infringement has occurred. My job also included making sure participants of Intramural Sports removed jewelry before participating and ensuring that participants have proper equipment in order to enforce safety.

I would consider myself a person who enjoys and watches sports on a regular basis. This is the reason why I was interested in the Intramural Sports position when I came across it on Handshake. I also had some experience in refereeing in which I often refereed at local Sunday Leagues games in my community. I believed with my love for sports in general and the experience I had in refereeing, I would be a perfect candidate for this role.

Working as an intramural referee on campus has provided me with many benefits in terms of flexibility in which balancing school and maintaining a job was easy. The ability of being able to travel to and from work without worrying about a means of transportation was also another blessing. Furthermore, as a referee, I had the opportunity to interact with a lot of different people from various cultures and backgrounds and this is what I valued the most during my time in the department. Being a referee has taught me many skills such as attention to details, problem-solving, and how to approach a problem. These are skills I have developed which are

Overall skills that I have gained from being an Intramural Sports referee are decision making, attention to details, problem-solving, and well-developed communication skills.
