- b. How much experience would be required to apply for that job, what degrees, certifications or training is required? Your doctorate from DPT program is required, License to practice, One year related PT experience, CPR certification.

Responsible for helping patients maintain, restore and improve movement, activity and function, Provides interventions, conducts reexaminations (every 30 days, at minimum), modifies interventions as necessary, and performs discharge planning. ANd whatever other duties are assigned.
