## Newspaper Assignment

In this paper I will try to describe and compare the flavor of discussion and presentation concerning a) global events and the broader world; b) advertisements; and c) local events took place on the 7<sup>th</sup> of September in the years of 1877, 1933, and 2001. Doing so will enable me to look back at past events previously unknown to me that occurred before and after my birth on the 7<sup>th</sup> of September 1997.

Global events that occurred on 1877 and 1933 would be the Russian war with Turkey and beginning opposition to Nazi Germany.
