Regaining Mobility and Diabetes Management

A primary health outcome would be for her to regain mobility, due to her femur surgery. It is important for her to regain this so that she is able to perform activities of daily living (ADLs); thus, she may need a referral to a physical therapist. She may also need education on any assistive devices prescribed and pain management, to help regain mobility. Other health outcomes may include patient education on how to properly handle her diabetes, such as checking her blood glucose after every meal. She may need a referral to a dietician, to further educate her intake in regard to her type 2 diabetes. Further monitoring and isolating herself, as well as, maintaining effective respiration and ventilation, is required, due to her testing positive for SARS-CoV-2 virus.

Healthcare Services Administration

Healthcare Administrator: Manage hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, etc. They provide leadership, management, and administration in a public health setting. These professionals need to be up to date on current healthcare policies and procedures.


Public Health Professional

Athletic Training

Athletic training provides easy and readily available access to health care in multiple populations, not just athletes as traditionally portrayed. With the right permissions by overseeing authority, the athletic trainer could be a frequent contributor in monitoring of the patient's conditions and being a constant presence throughout visits to other health care providers. Through being a constant/ accessible presence in the patient's life we are able to assist in the rehabilitation of her femur fracture and education in both managing her diabetes and her rehabilitation steps and processes. All of this would be done with precautions of SARS- CoV-2 virus and converting to a more hand on approach after she has been cleared.



INTERPROFESSIONAL COLLABORATION

Healthcare is a collaborative process that involves multiple disciplines, with the patient's health in mind, what makes it effective is based on each team member's specialty and it can affect the overall health outcome. To prevent fragmentation of care and promote continuity, there has to be a leading goal and effective communication between each member; for example, the nurse may refer the patient to a social service worker to help handle what treatments she can afford or giving turnover from outpatient to rehab. Practicing at the highest level of one's scope of practice may also contribute to effective coordination.
