- Practice
 - Practice asking and answering your questions out loud. If available, find a partner from class and practice together.

- Consider
 - What are some places that you notice you are having trouble communicating? Are there any new words or structures that you can learn before your conversation?

Sometimes it is hard for me to find the correct form of a verb past, present, preterite when talking with my partner. I learned when to use prefixes to a specific verb and when not to such as el, los, mi, me and so on.

- What are some techniques to help navigate a conversation? What sort of phrases would be helpful?

Y tu? Que repete por favor? Pay close attention to the speaker and what they are asking that way you can respond in a way that continues the conversation. Try not to ask yes or no questions or even give those responses. Be very clear and use lots of vocab from what ive learned in class.

Interact (15 min)

Remember, you do not have to talk for the entire 15 minutes. It is a conversation. Aim to participate in **at least 60%** of the conversation.

- (3-5 minutes) Introduce yourself to your conversation partner and get to know some basic information about each other.
- (10 minutes) Share about your family. Ask your conversation partner about their family.

□ Tips

- Try to *think* in the language of your conversation. Your ability to think in English is much more complex right now and often, problems arise when you think of something to say in English that you are not able to say in the target language.
- If there are words or major ideas that you don't understand, please ask your partner to help explain/elaborate.
- Remember, the conversation will be recorded so you don't have to understand 100% of what your partner says during the conversation. You will have time later to look up specific words.
- If your conversation goes a bit off topic, *that is ok!* The important takeaway from this is that you are building the ability and confidence to interact in the language.
- When your partner answers a question, try to ask a related follow-up question instead of moving directly to another prepared question that might not be related.

Reflect

 - Overall, how did your conversation go? Explain.
It went very well! I got to know a lot about my partner and where she is from and her family. I definitely was a little nervous giving talking to someone in another language that I had not spoken to or seen before. I am planning to do my second talkabroad with her again if it works out.

 - About what percentage of your partners' speech did you understand?

I would say I understood about 75% of what she was saying. There were only a few times where we both had to stop and reask or word the question or answer we were trying to say.

- What are three things that you would phrase or say differently after having listened to your conversation?

I would have probably introduced myself maybe a little differently to be more informative. When asking my questions I may have had more tone or emphasis giving whether it was a question or answer.

Also, make sure that I had more straight forward sentences and not kinda broken because it was our first one and I am not fluent in spanish as she did not understand my major being dental hygiene.

- List three interesting things you learned about your conversation partner based on their answers to your questions.

I learned that Julia has 3 siblings, 2 brothers and a sister. She also told me that she has a very mixed personality between both her mom and her dad. I did learn that she is in the middle out of her 35 cousins.

- What sort of cultural inferences or comparisons can you make about your interaction with your partner? If there is insufficient evidence, what comparisons can you make between your families?

Her family is very close to each other, as is my family. A difference is that her family all lived in the same area whereas my family does not live near me. Julia's family is definitely

larger than my family given she has 3 siblings and 35 cousins alone. That is about all the comparison I can do given it was our first conversation.

- Is there anything else about the language that you noticed?

Interact (15 min)

Remember, you do not have to talk for the entire 15 minutes. It is a conversation! Aim to participate in **at least 60%** of the conversation.

- (1-2 Minutes) Introduce yourself to your conversation partner and get to know some basic information about each other.
- (7-8 min) Ask your partner how they incorporate healthy routines into their daily lives. What are habits and activities they consider promote good health. Discuss any other areas of wellbeing you would like to discuss.
- (7-8 minutes) Talk about your favorite foods and places to eat. Ask your conversation partner about their preferences. What are some foods that you do not like to eat? Places you do not prefer to eat? Ask and share about some of the regional dishes in your country. What are some foods that are unique to your respective countries? Which foods do you have in common? What influences from other countries do you notice?

□ Tips

- Try to *think* in the language of your conversation. Your ability to think in English is much more complex right now and often, problems arise when you think of something to say in English that you are not able to say in the target language.
- If there are words or major ideas that you don't understand, please ask your partner to help explain/elaborate.

My conversation went very well. It was awesome as we also got to talk about where she was from, which was Bogota, Columbia. The reason was because I just got back from there a day before Thanksgiving from a week long mission trip. We talked about what I enjoyed most about Bogota and my favorite foods from there. Also about differences between there and Virginia itself.

- About what percentage of your partners' speech did you understand?

90% of it I understood, as I was able to answer pretty much all her questions being asked.

- What are three things that you would phrase or say differently after having listened to your conversation?

I would have made sure to make clearer sentences when speaking. Another thing I could have done was asked her more about her family instead of the basic introductions. Lastly, I tried to use more of the vocab words since I froze and forgot some.

- List three interesting things you learned about your conversation partner based on their answers to your questions.

I learned that her favorite food is tamales, empanadas, and rice. Her favorite restaurant is a taco place there in Bogota, Columbia where she lives. I also thought it was interesting that she was from Bogota, Columbia as I was just there for a week before Thanksgiving for a mission trip with my church. Also, another interesting thing was that she thought it was cold

in Columbia whereas it is way colder here in Virginia.

- What sort of cultural inferences or comparisons can you make about your interaction with your partner? If there is insufficient evidence, what comparisons can you make between your families?

We both enjoy the same foods even though we are in different countries. She has heard English before as she kind of knew some of it. She has a big family and they live together which is the same for me. I will say that their culture is very talkative and wants to know all about you, especially being from the states. Another observation from also being there over a week ago.

Practice using some more words that make sentences flow together or connect better.




