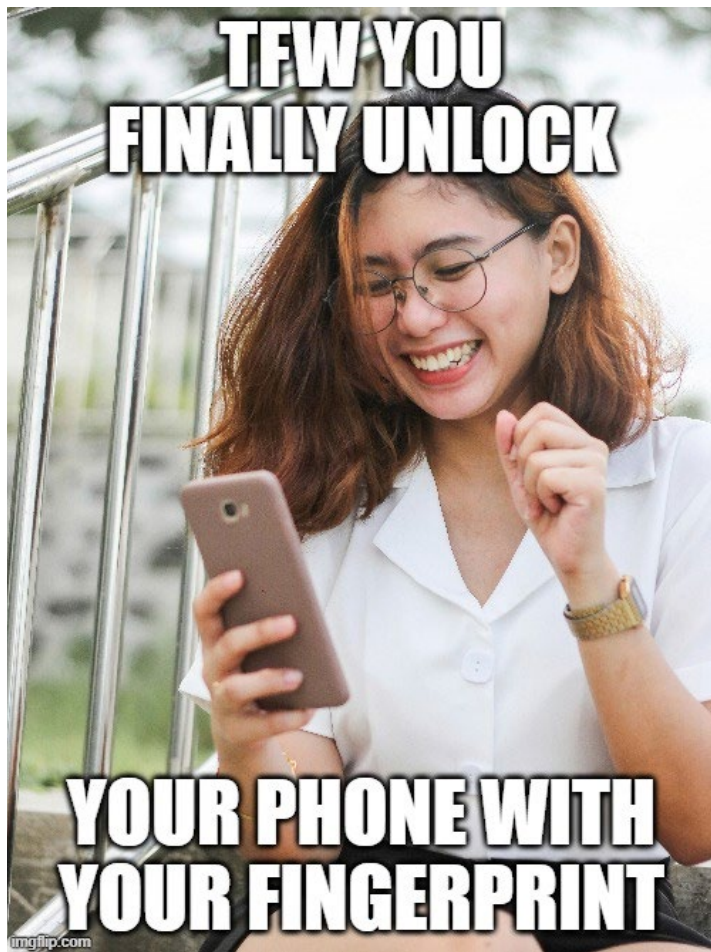


Journal Entry 7
