Remember that UPS will never contact you via sms unless you filed a case for missing package.

Old Dominion duo push attacks were prevalent last year within the fall until late December. They would send an email to the university student's phone saying were you trying to log into a location and in some cases they would also send sms at the same time a fake IP saying they're on campus locally with websites to fake scholarly websites. Example: <https://www.odu.edu/Library>
Real: <https://www.odu.edu/library> They used a capital i instead of a l to fake it.

During this week when trying to pay off my housing application to live on campus which is a good sum of money, I decided to text my aunt I sounded so robotic to her including the way I asked for money to link my email to my zelle had her in distress that she texted other family members if I was real or not. This isn't uncommon practice if many others utilize their emails instead of their phone numbers to be linked with their Zelle. This happened to a previous family member when someone impersonated a family member providing them a phone number that resulted in their zelle being temporarily shut down. So in all make sure to double-check where the request is coming from and other family members before sending money to Zelle accounts.
