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Self Assessment

- 1. Using each course objective listed in the syllabus, identify and describe your level of skills and knowledge as you (a) entered the course and (b) completed the course.
 - Know and understand the interdisciplinary nature of learning
- A. I understood that interdisciplinarity was a concept, but did not know the extent of it or the role it played in learning.
- B. I now understand that learning itself is often completely interdisciplinary. Even in potential cases where some could argue it is not, it's very likely that by including principles of interdisciplinarity into these cases, you could increase the proficiency and efficiency of the learner anyway.

 - A. I thought of interdisciplinarity as likely a great complement to critical thinking but did not know the details.
